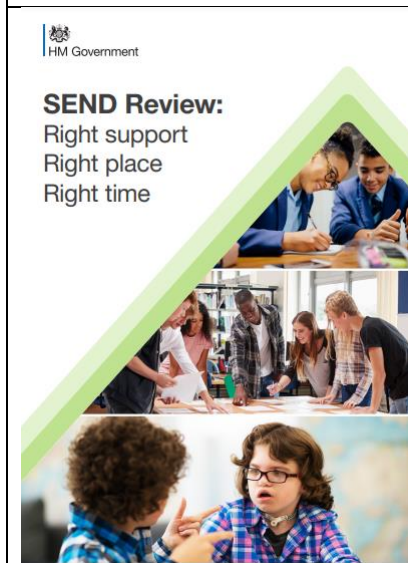
The SEND Review and Alternative Provision Green Paper consultation

	<p>We want to know what you think about the support you get at school and in your community.</p>
	<p>The government have looked at how children and young people with SEND are supported. They want to make some changes.</p>
	<p>SEND stands for special educational needs and disabilities.</p>



Alternative Provision is as a different type of education place from a mainstream school.

There are lots of different types and could include a hospital school or a pupil referral unit.



The government have written a **SEND Review Green Paper** to share the changes they want to make.

What is a Green Paper?





A Green Paper is a document with suggestions and ideas to change the law. This green paper is about how young people with SEND are supported.




The changes could happen in the future if enough people agree to them.

What is the consultation for?

	The consultation is a chance to get your voice heard and share your thoughts.
	We want to know what you think about the changes the government has talked about.

How can you take part in the consultation?

	You will share your thoughts on the changes in a focus group.

What will happen with what you tell us?

We will give the report to the government.



The government will know what you think about the SEND Review Green Paper.

What happens after I have participated in the focus group?



You will get a certificate.
