



Externally Accredited Results 2022

Level 2 Qualifications – 1 student in year 11 gained 3 GCSE qualifications grade 5 or above despite being a school refuser prior to joining Epina. These grades were above predictions of grade 4, this is outstanding achievement! 13 students in year 11 gained at least 1 Level 2 qualification, this is GCSE grade 4 equivalent and was higher than originally predicted and our highest ever recorded number of level 2 qualifications! This represented 62% of KS4 leavers during the school year 2021/22, which was almost double the achievement of 38.89% in 2020/21 and also higher than the 20% achieved in 2019/20.

Level 1 Qualifications - 100% of our Y11 students who were entered for a qualification, achieved at least one Level 1 by the end of KS4.

19 of these students achieved 3 or more Level 1 qualifications (from 61% 2021 to 90% 2022) and 5 students achieved 5 or more level 1 qualifications (from 16.67% 2021 to 23.81% 2022) which are both increases on the previous year (2020) and in some cases higher than the grades predicted at the start of the academic year!

1 student achieved 5 or more Level 1 qualifications including English and Maths.

Entry Level Certificate – 100% of the year 11 students entered achieved an Entry Level Certificate in Maths and English. 1 student was not put forward for Entry Level Maths or English as they had already achieved a higher L1 in the subjects. 80.95% of the students achieved 5 or more entry level qualifications including English and Maths which is a massive increase from 2021 which was 38.89%.

14 students were entered for Entry Level science, 100% of these students achieved a higher Entry Level qualification than first anticipated, this can be attributed to Covid catch up intervention and focussed support.

It must be noted that all of the qualifications gained in 2022 were actual results assessed via coursework completion or exams sat.

*The decrease in value is due to the higher number of students entered for higher level qualifications students, working at level 1 or 2 would not be entered for Entry Level qualifications in those subject areas as they will have already achieved these in year 11.

Level 2 Qualifications – We had a 145.5% increase on the number of students gaining Level 2 qualifications which is a fantastic achievement. As a school we have worked hard to find level 2 qualifications that are accessible for our students and prepare them for adulthood. These students completed qualifications in financial education.

Level 1 Qualifications - 100% of our Y13 students who were entered for L1 qualifications achieved 3 or more which is an increase on the previous year (from 89% 2021 to 100% 2022) and those achieving 5 or more level 1 qualifications massively increased (from 22.22% 2021 to 90.91% 2022) an increase of 309% on the previous year (2021).

7 students achieved 5 or more Level 1 qualifications including English and maths. This represents 64% of the cohort, this is a 186% increase from 2021.

Entry Level Certificate – 100% of the year 13 students achieved 1 or more Entry Level Certificates which is a 12.5% increase on the previous year. Those achieving 5 or more Entry Level qualifications has seen a 100% decrease from 2020 but it must be noted that this is due to more students completing higher level qualifications and fewer entries.
