HEADLINES

- Whole school attendance target for the year is 94.5%
- Whole school attendance for the term was 92.37%
- Whole school attendance year to date was 93.25%
- 120 pupils (59.4%) had attendance of over 95% (outstanding attendance) for the half term
- 108 pupils (53.4%) had attendance of over 95% (outstanding attendance) year to date
- 11 pupils (5.4%) had 100% attendance year to date.

How is your attendance?

- > Outstanding attendance = 95% or above
- > Good attendance = between 90% and 94.9%
- Requires improvement attendance = between 85% and 89.9%
- Inadequate attendance= 84.9% and below

Attendance aims & priorities

- > Target: to achieve whole school attendance of 94.5%
- How will we achieve this?: First day response, home visits, pastoral telephone calls home, assemblies, well done post cards, letters home, school meetings with parents / carers.
- House reward system: celebrating 100% attendance. Pupils achieving 100% attendance for the term will be entered into a raffle. Lucky winners receive a £50 voucher.
- Consistency: Attendance and pastoral teams working together to identify barriers to attendance and delivering appropriate actions and interventions to address issues.
- Parental engagement: continual communication with families through social media, school website, school displays, assemblies and parent events.
- Attendance data: half termly data analysis procedures to monitor individual and group pupil attendance. All staff receive weekly individual and class attendance information.
- Letters: half termly letters to parents/carers where we have attendance concerns.
- Local Authority Attendance Team: involvement if attendance concerns continue.

What can you do to help your child's attendance?

- It is important your child attends school as regularly as possible.
- Wherever possible, please book appointments outside the school day. If this is not possible, your child will be marked as "M" (medical appointment).
- Inform school as soon as possible if your child is going to be absent.
- If your child is unwell or absent for any other reason, please contact the school office before 9.15am on each day of absence.
- Contact your child's pastoral teacher if you feel your child is unhappy in school.
- Contact Ronice Jopling if you feel there is anything we can do to support your child's attendance.
