

# **Externally Accredited Results 2023**

Level 2 Qualifications – We didn't have any students entered for GCSE this year, the previous years' achievement was due to 1 legacy student who under our new designation would not have gained a place in Epinay School, however all the year 11 students who chose a level 2 qualification achieved it. Our level 2 qualifications generally come from an option subject which students can choose. The lower figure is due to fewer students choosing that option in the 2022/23 co-hort. It should be noted that **over half** of the year 11 cohort achieved at least 1 level 2 qualification.

**Level 1 Qualifications** - 100% of our Y11 students **who were entered** for a qualification, achieved at least one Level 1 by the end of KS4. 8 (47.06%) of these students achieved 3 or more Level 1 qualifications. 4 students were entered for an additional qualification (at a higher level than predicted) **100**% of these students entered for Level 1 Functional Skills Maths achieved the qualification, **above prediction**. 2/13 students entered for an RE qualification achieved a level 1 which is a lot higher level than first predicted.

**Entry Level Certificate – 100%** of the year 11 students entered achieved an **Entry Level Certificate in Maths and English**. 82.35% of the students achieved 5 or more entry level qualifications including English and Maths which is an **increase** from 2022 which was 80.95%.

A number of year 11 students achieved higher Entry Level results than were predicted as follows:

Science - 9/11 (82%)

Maths 2/17 (12%)

Life and Living Skills 5/6 (83%)

Independent Living, Rights and Responsibilities 10/10 (100% additional qualification achieved by Independent Living, Living in the Community students)

15/17 (88.23%) year 11 students achieved at least one Entry Level qualification at higher grade than anticipated.

The decreased values in L1 qualifications is due to the 2022-23 cohort, 3 SLD learners and 1 student non-attender due to mental health needs. Higher numbers of students were entered for Entry Level qualifications hence the increase in figure of 5 or more ELC. It must be noted that consideration of need and level of learning difficulty is variable year on year and cohort is a significant consideration in terms of entries, for the first year Epinay 6<sup>th</sup> form has a life skills group formed from this year's leavers.

### GCSE/L2 qualifications 2023

Level 2 Qualifications – 100% of the students entered for Level 2 qualifications achieved these. We had fewer L2 entries this year due to students completing 'bridging' qualifications who were not ready for the jump from Level 1 to Level 2. As a school we have worked hard to find level 2 qualifications that are accessible for our students and prepare them for adulthood, however one of the qualifications we use in financial education is due to be discontinued and this will have an impact on outcomes moving forward.

### L1 qualifications 2023

Level 1 Qualifications - 92% of our Y13 students who were entered for L1 qualifications achieved 3 or more which is outstanding, the figures for those achieving 5 or more level 1 qualifications has decreased due to the availability of suitable Level 1 courses. Many of the qualifications we have previously used have been discontinued. We are working hard to source replacements, however it must be noted that a bigger emphasis for Epinay as a request from parents is now on work experience, preparation for adulthood and life skills.

The only Entry Level qualifications we run in 6<sup>th</sup> form are maths and English, the only students entered for these qualifications are those that did not achieve the highest possible Entry Level in year 11. The below figures demonstrate that the numbers of students who did not achieve as high as possible in year 11 were lower in the 22/23 cohort as only 7 students were entered whereas in the previous year all students took maths and/or English ELC.

Overall 10/12 (83.3%) of year 13 students gained all qualifications entered at the predicted grade and 1/5 (20%) students gained a higher than predicted Entry Level certificate in maths.
